


### Above the Falls: HEALTH IMPACT ASSESSMENT





#### PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT SUMMARY


#### The HIA Project Team and partners:

- Presented to 21 local committees, community groups and neighborhood organizations
- Conducted outreach at 15 community events
- Collected nearly 400 community-input online and paper surveys
- Received over 120 RIVER comment cards
- Saints Cyril and Methodius Church: Latino Engagement (~150 attendees)
- Lao Assistance Center: South East Asian Engagement (~30 attendees)


# Community Input



Which of the following possible future changes to the Upper Mississippi Riverfront would positively affect your health, wellbeing, and enjoyment of the riverfront?






Top three things from Lao and Latino forums ...

- A marketplace and community gardens (Lao only)


### HEALTH IMPACT: PREDICTIONS

Northeast


North Side

jobs: strong potential health impact for North Side residents



# housing: increased neighborhood livability

- Affordable for whom?
- Extent of residential & commercial mix and overall neighborhood "livability"?
- Reach of the impact?

### summary of findings:

- Residents clearly see the addition of new parks and trails as potentially improving their health
- Research makes the strongest connections between income-generating uses and improvements in health
- Residents do not directly connect additional housing and jobs along the riverfront with having a positive impact on their own health
- Residents have concerns about "not enough jobs nearby" and "poor quality housing" that negatively impacts their health
